PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

This programme caters to all teachers from the public and private schools at the nursery, primary and secondary levels. In addition, persons from the general public who are desirous of improving their personal and professional development can also access courses in this programme. Participants are expected to approach the selected course with commitment and enthusiasm. Therefore, selection of the desired course(s) is critical. A certificate will be awarded to each person who successfully completes a course.

PROGRAMME LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Use a variety of interactive strategies and methods to deliver instruction in diverse environments.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the developmental stages and characteristics of the adult learner.
3. Demonstrate competence in utilising a variety of technologies and resources to enhance teaching and learning.
4. Apply strategies to cater to the needs of diverse adult learners.
5. Value the importance of lifelong learning and continuous professional development by tailoring content to meet the needs of the adult learner.
6. Demonstrate attitudes and behaviours consistent with ethical standards of the work environment.
7. Cater to the needs of the adult learner by delivering courses that promote continued growth and development.
8. Use a variety of appropriate assessment strategies to evaluate, guide and support instruction.

REGULATIONS

1. Applicants **MUST REGISTER AND PAY COURSE FEES IN FULL** by the registration deadline.
2. Teachers in the government service may access the programmes at a reduced cost. Hence, their forms **MUST** be **SIGNED** by the Principal and **STAMPED** with the stamp of the school to which they are attached.
3. If, for any reason, a course participant has to discontinue classes, the Programme Coordinator must be informed promptly, in writing.
4. Participants will **NOT** be reimbursed if they have attended **four (4) classes** or if the course has been taught for **four (4) weeks** in the semester. However, participants will be reimbursed 50 % of the total fee if they attend classes for **(2) weeks only**.
5. Fees may be paid at the **Accounts Department, Monday to Friday**, during the hours of **9:00 a.m.** and **3:00 p.m.** **Please also note that the collage is currently negotiating with SurePay to arrange for payments for courses.**
6. All participants are requested to complete an evaluation form at the end of each semester.
7. A certificate will be awarded on the successful completion of each course. Participants are required to collect their certificates from the College and sign on receipt of the same.

ACTION RESEARCH

This course is designed to provide participants with opportunities to examine real life problems in the workplace and classroom. Methods will be devised for analysing these problems and exploring possible measures to be implemented.

Action research, like other types of research, is critical to educators and other social scientists. It is a continuous and reflective process that could provide a model for professional development.

Topics include: The action research process (problem identification and diagnosis, types of data collection); definition of action research, the teacher/social scientist as an action researcher; the relationship between action research and the development of knowledge; and the role of action research in facilitating professional development.

This course is designed specifically for persons who have successfully completed the Basic Bookbinding course. Participants will be introduced to a range of more complex techniques and processes that will enhance and refine their existing bookbinding skills.

Hence, some of the techniques to be acquired will include sewing, hidden sewing, spines with no sewing, glue-free constructions and finishing processes.

Additionally, participants will be provided with opportunities to explore innovative and creative ways of designing and finishing books. Emphasis will be placed on the selection of materials of different textures based on purpose and use, and finishes that are professional and appealing to the eye. In addition, the advantages and disadvantages of all methods used will be discussed and demonstrated.

The objective of this course is to equip participants with bookbinding techniques. These techniques will enable them to preserve personal papers, repair and maintain old and damaged books, and design and construct books. They will also be made aware of the various methods of applications used in book binding.

In addition, participants will be familiarised with the terminologies in the bookbinding process. Participants will also become acquainted with the different styles, designs, and materials used at each stage of book binding; the types of paper used to make books and the correct tools and equipment needed.

BASIC COUNSELLING

This course is designed to provide students with a knowledge of the basic counselling theories. The major psychological theories used to guide the therapeutic practice of professional counsellors will be addressed. Students will also be provided with a theoretical introduction to specialties in counselling, such as child abuse counselling, drug abuse counselling and family therapy.

Theories will be presented as conceptual frameworks through which counsellors will be provided with a clear understanding of their clients. Furthermore, participants will be provided with opportunities to apply the theories in order to gain a deeper understanding of themselves.

This course targets individuals who (1) need to understand more about the theory of counselling, (2) need to increase their effectiveness as counsellors (3) are considering becoming involved in counselling others, and (4) are experiencing difficulties coping with challenges of everyday living.

CHILD PROTECTION EDUCATION: TOOLS FOR EARLY LEARNERS

This course is designed for Early Childhood Educators, day-care workers and parents. Participants will be equipped with the skills and knowledge on how to address issues relating to bullying, appropriate touch, and the correct way of reporting abuse.

Additionally, the theoretical underpinnings of child protection education will form part of the content of this course. Practical skills, as well as, age-appropriate instructional plans and activities will also be the focus of this course.

Topics include: Child abuse, bullying, methods of reporting child abuse, theory and practice of child protection and the impact of culture and religion.

CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

This course is designed to provide participants with techniques and skills which will enable them to address classroom management problems. Additionally, it will equip them with strategies for establishing a safe and comfortable learning environment. Participants will explore teaching strategies and approaches which will motivate students and enhance teaching and learning.

Emphasis will be placed on social and emotional learning. Additionally, the course will provide participants with classroom management strategies that will focus on promoting a positive classroom climate and environment conducive to teaching and learning.

Topics include: current brain research, learning styles, multiple intelligences, IQ versus EQ, identifying children with special needs, classroom management, classroom

arrangement, co-operative learning, authentic learning and assessment, and teacher characteristics.

CODING AND ROBOTICS

This course is intended to introduce participants to block coding using the programme, SCRATCH. It will also provide them with knowledge and skill of Educational ROBOTICS using VEX code and VEX Robots. Additionally, while the rudiments of block and coding are introduced, it is critical to note that an emphasis will be placed on the thinking processes that give rise to the code in order to realise maximum gains. Furthermore, the very nature of the approach to coding implies the importance of planning, testing, evaluating and tweaking. In this regard, during the course, mistakes are inevitable and it is important that participants feel comfortable learning from mistakes.

Finally, Educational Robotics will provide participants the opportunity to exercise their voice and choice in learning by engaging and participating in activities that demand the use of problem solving skills. In addition, Educational Robotics will require participants to be actively engaged in problem finding, problem construction, problem analysis, problem monitoring and problem evaluation. Additionally, some necessary attributes that will enable participants to reason strategically will be developed.

Participants will be familiarised with a range of techniques and methodologies of teaching in various early childhood settings.

Topics include: History of early childhood education, understanding the young child, children and play, health and safety, classroom management, quality nutrition for life, discipline and working with parents.

Participants who have successfully completed both levels of the programme will be eligible to undertake a six (6) week practicum. The practicum will be conducted during the months of October and November and participants will be requested to pay a fee of \$200.00.

Topics include: Developmental theories of philosophers, the learning environment, inclusion in early childhood education programmes, creativity and helping children manage conflict.
